

Annual PREA Report for Corrective Action January, 2019 - December, 2019

Pursuant to national PREA (Prison Rape Elimination Act) Standard 115.88, the Barnstable County Sheriff's Office is providing the public a copy of its annual review of PREA investigations, operational challenges relative to PREA and corrective actions taken to prevent, detect and respond to inmate sexual abuse and sexual harassment within its correctional facility.

Within the months of January – December 2019, the following has occurred:

1. The average number of inmates within the Barnstable County Correctional Facility is 293. All inmates receive information regarding PREA during orientation and throughout their incarceration.
2. The number of total PREA related incidents reported within the Barnstable County Correctional Facility is 9 with 1 of these being disclosure of past facility incidents which were referred to the appropriate authorities.
3. From January 2016, there were 0 unsubstantiated PREA reports, 0 substantiated reports and 8 reports proved to be unfounded, 0 under investigation and 1 reported at another facility. 9 involved male victims and 0 involved female victims.
4. There were 3 staff-on-inmate allegations investigated and 0 were substantiated, 0 unsubstantiated, 3 unfounded and 0 with ongoing investigations.
5. Within the past year noted, 0 allegations were proven to be substantiated cases of sexual abuse and 0 were proven to be substantiated cases of sexual harassment. From January 2019 – December 2019 there have not been any sexual abuse cases which resulted in criminal prosecution.

To prevent possible retaliation, PREA investigators monitor alleged victims of sexual abuse for a period of 90 days. There were no cases of retaliation identified within the past 12 months.

A PREA Review Committee examines each completed PREA investigation to determine whether or not changes to existing policy, practice and staffing levels are necessary, as well as improvements to monitoring technology.

Compared to the previous reporting year, 2018, our PREA incidents decreased by 50% which could be attributed to improved supervisory and direct supervision training, as well as clear communication with the inmates on the gravity with legal consequences of false PREA incident reporting.
